



# Visit Rushden Transport Museum

**Come along to Rushden Station**, Station Road, Rushden NN10 0AW and see the unique RHTS collection of transport memorabilia. The museum is housed in the four station rooms of the 1894, Midland Railway Company's branch line. Originally running on a single track between Wellingborough to Higham Ferrers, the railway was built in response to the growing boot and shoe industry of the area making it socially significant up until it finally closed in 1969. There is something for everyone in the nostalgic surroundings. Why is there a sloping floor? Who were the staff? What is The Lancer? Our volunteers will help you discover the answers; and for our younger visitors there are quizzes for all ages.

**Admission is free** but donations are very welcome.
